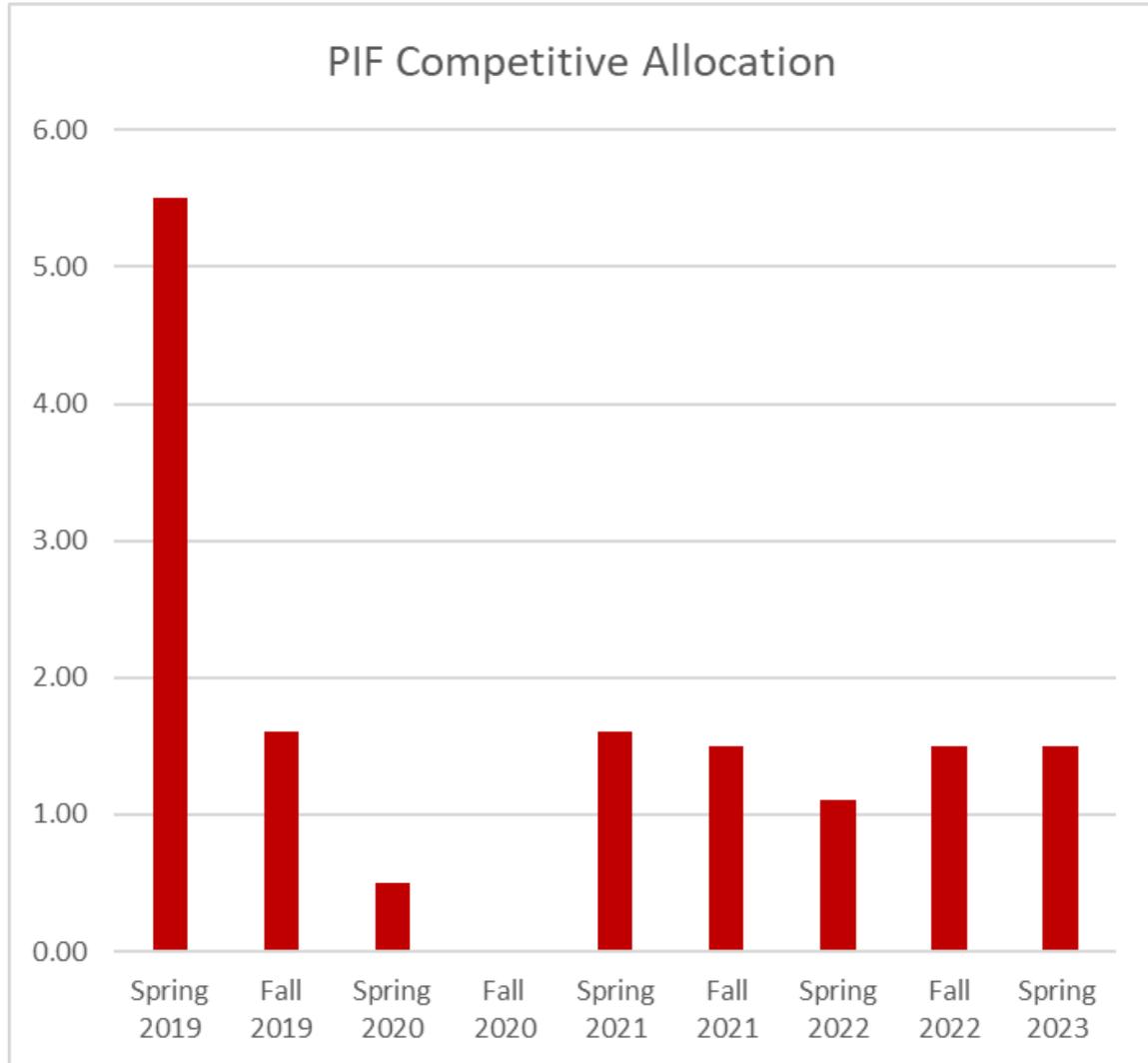

Guiding Principles

- Transparent
- Nimble and proactive in funding high-impact projects that align with the [University's strategic goals](#) and support our ambitions for institutional excellence and distinctiveness

- Competitive submission process started in Spring 2019.
- No competitive submission in Fall 2020 (pandemic).
- Partner with others to find other sources of funding.
- Reports are available on the [PIF website](#) > transparency

Funding Priorities

- Increasing student success, graduation, and retention, especially for groups underrepresented within the relevant disciplines.
- Promoting growth and opportunities to generate new net revenue for the institution.
- Expanding student experiential learning, including undergraduate research opportunities.
- Enhancing research capacity.
- Promoting diversity and inclusivity.

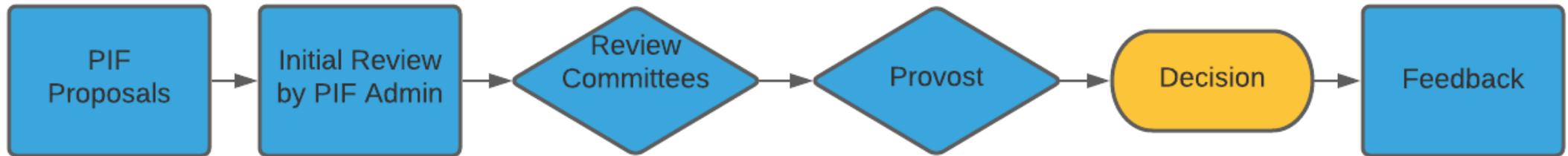

PIF Fall and Spring Cycles

Cycle	Open for Submission	Submission Deadline	Official Response By
Fall	Mid August	Early October	Mid December
Spring	Early January	Late February	Mid April

- \$1M per cycle to be awarded.
- Funding range: \$15,000 - \$100,000 per year for a maximum of two years.
- Eligibility: Full-time Faculty and Staff; Department Heads / Chairs / Directors
- Process from proposal submissions, reviews, awards, and progress reports are done using **InfoReady** > Arizona Cultivate.

PIF Review Process



- Peer reviewed by faculty, staff, and students.
- Send out call for nominations to be PIF reviewers. About 30 per cycle.
- Reviewers will provide feedback on the strengths and weaknesses for each proposal, to be shared with proposers.

Lessons Learned and Best Practices

- Establish funding priorities.
- Assign proposals into categories/relevant operational areas.
- Set up funding limit: amount and period.
- Create thorough proposal submission guidelines. Be clear on the maximum number of pages/words/characters > InfoReady form feature.
- Set up submission deadline during the weekday around noon.
- Involve campus community in the review process.
- Continuous improvement via feedback.
